Hilliard Square Theater

It was reported on Cleveland.com that the City has received a grant from the County in the amount of \$200,000 for asbestos removal at the Hilliard Square Theater. Demolition costs are estimated at around \$800,000. Bruce Geisselman, the reporter, is looking for additional information on the issue and building history. The Lakewood Historical Society has building history material from when the theater was on a home tour about a decade ago.
