## **I. FY20 Funding Applicant Presentation Session #2**

### **A. Neighborhood Family Practice/North Coast Community Health Center**

Jean Polster, President & CEO of Neighborhood Family Practice which merged with North Coast Health in 2019, described and answered questions regarding NFP/NCH's request for \$64,500 in FY20 Community Development Block Grant funds to support its Health Services Program which provides a broad range of high-quality, culturally sensitive health care services for low-moderate income, medically underserved Lakewood households.

### **B. Lakewood Community Services Center**

Trish Rooney, Executive Director of Lakewood Community Services Center, described and answered questions regarding the following FY20 LCSC Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) and Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) funding requests.

#### **i. Food Pantry/Emergency Food Services (CDBG)**

Ms. Rooney described and answered questions regarding LCSC's request for \$57,321 in FY20 Community Development Block Grant funds to support the agency's Food Pantry/Emergency Food Services Program which combats hunger and malnutrition by distributing more than 40,000 pounds of free food to hundreds of very low-income Lakewood residents each month.

#### **ii. Case Management Services (CDBG)**

Ms. Rooney described and answered questions regarding LCSC's request for \$26,620 in FY20 Community Development Block Grant funds to support its Case Management Services Program which provides salary support for licensed social workers who support low-moderate income Lakewood residents struggling with unemployment, unstable housing instability, lack of medical insurance, mental health concerns, and a host of other serious issues.

**iii. Homelessness Prevention Assistance (ESG)**

Ms. Rooney described and answered questions regarding LCSC's request for \$120,000 in FY20 Emergency Solutions Grant funding to support the agency's Homelessness Prevention Assistance Program which provides housing stability case management and housing search and placement services as well as cash assistance for rent and/or utilities for very low-income Lakewood households at imminent risk of becoming homeless.

**iv. Emergency Shelter Services/Breathing Room (ESG)**

Ms. Rooney described and answered questions regarding LCSC's request for \$20,000 in FY20 Emergency Solutions Grant funding to support the agency's Emergency Shelter Services/Breathing Room Program which provides short-term temporary shelter complemented by a broad array of essential supportive services to literally homeless Lakewood families and helps them secure decent, safe, affordable housing in Lakewood upon exiting.

**II. Business Meeting**

- CAC Chair Lee Silvis called the new business portion of CAC Session #2 to order and called the roll.
- A motion to approve the 10.2.19 CAC Session #1 Minutes was made, seconded, and Session #1 minutes were approved.
- Mr. Dan Wyman informed the Committee regarding a change in the presentation schedule and provided members with an overview of the remainder of the FY20 CAC process including the member allocation worksheet; Storefront Program challenges and improvements; and the proposed Substantial Amendment to Lakewood's FY19 HUD Annual Action Plan.
- Mr. Silvis requested a motion to adjourn FY20 CAC Session #2. I was seconded and passed unanimously.
