1. Committee of the Whole Report regarding Council Board/Commission/Task Force Appointments. Mr. Powers, Chair (To Be Provided)

Mr. Powers provided the following oral report:

Dear Members of Council, as you know the Committee of the whole met to interview and discuss appointments to a number of Boards and Commissions and we have two recommendations that came out of that on our last meeting. The Committee recommended to the full Council that we insert the name William Gaydos into the resolution regarding the Planning Commission and that we insert the name Michelle McCue in the resolution regarding the Audit Committee. The are two very fine, upstanding members of our community who bring diverse set of talents to our community and we appreciate the willingness to serve and both of these individuals have acknowledged that should we vote tonight to approve those resolutions they would fulfill all the duties of these positions and we will make those motions shortly.

We also had some discussion around the Lakewood Tree task Force that was deferred out of that meeting of the Committee of the Whole and we continued earlier this evening and will continue that discussion again, tonight after the full Council meeting. Executive Session is expected to be called with respect to finalization, hopefully of our Tree Task Force appointments.

5. Public Safety Committee Report regarding Ordinances No. 44-12. (To Be Provided). Mr. Nowlin, Chair.

The Public Safety Committee met prior to the Council meeting. All members of the Committee were present as well as Law Director Butler and members of the public. Proposed Ordinance 44-12 was the sole item on the agenda and relates to texting while driving. The Committee has discussed the ordinance for some time and one of the key elements of the discussion is trying to raise public awareness as to the dangers of this behavior. Councilman Anderson addressed the ordinance from the beginning and has done a great job shepherding it through and working with everyone to get the issue in the public forefront.

The Committee had a good discussion. The proposed ordinance would mirror the state's recently passed law concerning texting while driving with the exception of making it a primary offense for adults. What we gathered from discussion, testimony, and conversations with members of the administration and the police department was that the full time and attention ordinance basically already achieves that goal of making texting while driving a primary offense for adults. So, the proposed ordinance would not have been necessary.

The Committee discussed a desire to continue to work with the administration in increasing public awareness and potentially putting up signage around the city to make motorists aware that texting while driving is illegal through this ordinance and the full time and attention ordinance. It was noted by Councilman Anderson in our discussion that there was a study in *Car and Driver* in 2009 that showed drivers 25 and older demonstrating slower reaction times when texting and driving than driver younger than 25. The point is that we need to ensure that all members of the community, not just the young folks, are aware of the dangers of texting while driving.

To that end, the Committee unanimously recommended adoption of a revised ordinance to Council. That version will mirror the state code and is different from the original version in that it drops the language of making texting while driving a primary offense. Police will not be able to pull adults over solely for texting while driving although they so have the option of doing that under the full time and attention ordinance.

The Housing Committee met at 6:30 p.m. on Monday, January 14, 2013. All members of the Committee were present and three items were discussed.

 Resolution No. 8629-12 – extension of time by which the City of Lakewood may spend funds under the Neighborhood Stabilization Program III area grant. Council approved the acceptance of a \$250,000 NSP III Grant from Cuyahoga County in September, 2011. These funds were designed to acquire and rehab three distressed or foreclosed homes located in NSP III target areas with an anticipated completion deadline of January 11, 2013. On December 17, 2012, Mayor Summers' administration asked Council to consider Resolution 8629-12 that would amend the current NSP III agreement by extending the completion deadline to December 31, 2013.

By way of an update, two Lakewood properties have been purchased with NSP III funds. The house at 1459 Lakewood has been rehabbed and is on the market now. Work nears completion at 1437 Hall and is expected to be on the market this upcoming June. A third property has been identified and a bid is pending. The requested extension specifies that this third property be market ready by the end of 2013.

The Administration reported that the Cuyahoga County Department of Development agreed to this extension. Committee members voted unanimously to recommend Council's approval of this Resolution. The Committee and Administration also pledged to hold a hearing in the near future regarding all NSP funded projects in the City of Lakewood.

- 2. **Discussion of Housing License Fees** The Committee and Administration briefly discussed the issue of housing licenses for rental properties. Currently, a party that purchased, for example, a Lakewood three family home in October 2012 would have to pay the full \$180 fee for all of 2012 then pay the exact same fee for 2013 just two months later. The Administration pledged to work with the Committee to determine how many new owners are impacted by this policy in any given year. Should the numbers show that this is a compelling issue to address, the Committee will extend a discussion on a number of different scenarios and suggestions including many that were briefly offered during the January 14 Committee hearing.
- 3. **Housing Forward 2012 Update** The Administration reported that the 1,700 category "three" homes identified for specific intervention have been reassessed and has decreased significantly to 900. Communication to the owners of these remaining 900 will occur around late March 2013.

Parkwood Resident

dresses Council regarding Ordinance 1793. The Ordinance states that a licensed physician is required to oversee all tattooing within the City. The resident and a business partner are seeking to establish a tattoo business in Lakewood. He is looking for support from Council to amend the ordinance. He stated that the ordinance was enacted in 1996. He assumed this was for health reasons because the State did not begin regulating tattoos until 1997. Tattooing was not legalized in Cleveland until 2001. The resident stated that the State thoroughly regulates tattooing as in other states where he has worked. He stated that he has a potential location selected for a business adjacent to The Shore Diner. He indicates the business owners are supportive of him. He indicates he moved to Lakewood with his wife in 2011. He works in Elyria as a tattoo artist. He stated he would prefer to work in Lakewood to be close to his home and family.

He stated he believes that a tattoo business would benefit Lakewood by filling empty storefronts and generating taxes. As a tattoo artist his business partner has worked with charitable organizations such as March of Dimes, Humane Society, and Susan G. Komen. He is interested in continuing these efforts within Lakewood. He works with two other artists at Chronic Tattoo in Elyria. All currently live in Lakewood and would love to work in and contribute to the community that they live in. The resident indicated his business partner has an established business of over 20 years with no record of health code violation.

Lakewood Ave Resident

stated that he is the owner of the quadricycle bike. He acquired the bike to transport his autistic son. The quadricyclye is the only transportation he has during the day when his girlfriend takes the family car to work. He says the quadricycle is sturdy and secure and he is confident his son is safe next to him on it. He stated his desire to continue
