Lakewood Department of Human Services (DHS)

Childcare Scholarship Assistance

Senior Supportive Services

Jessica Parker, Programs Manager in Lakewood's Department of Human Services, described and answered questions regarding the Division of Early Childhood's \$78,000 FY18 Community Development Block Grant request to support the Childcare Scholarship Assistance Program which provides subsidies that enable low-moderate income Lakewood households to afford high quality childcare in a Lakewood-based facility.

Katherine Kurtz, Clinical Manager in Lakewood's Department of Human Services, described and answered questions regarding the Division of Aging's \$34,195 FY18 Community Development Block Grant request to support Senior Supportive Services program that works closely with Lakewood residents ages 62 and over and their caregivers to ensure they have access to the resources they need to safely and comfortably age in place.

North Coast Health

Health Services

Gina Gavlak, Executive Director of North Coast Health, described and answered questions regarding NCH's request \$64,500 FY18 Community Development Block Grant funds to support the Health Services Program.

The Health Services Program provides comprehensive, accessible, coordinated, medical care for un- and under-insured Lakewood residents including primary care; chronic disease management; women's health services; prescription assistance; specialty referrals; behavioral health case management; laboratory and medical testing; and smoking cessation and prevention.

Lakewood Department of Public Works
Street Resurfacing
Water Main Replacement

After explaining the standardized Pavement Condition Rating (PCR) system the Department of Public Works utilizes to prioritize street improvements in CDBG-eligible areas, City Engineer Mark Papke, described and answered questions regarding the department's \$460,000 FY18 Community Development Block Grant request to support its LMA Street & Water Main Improvements Program which proposes re-paving portions of the following (4) deteriorated roadways in Lakewood's CDBG-eligible areas.

- Garfield from Lincoln to Brown;
- Lewis from Athens to Lakewood Heights;
- Winchester from Franklin to Madison

Mr. Papke then described and answered questions regarding the Department of Public Works' \$100,000 FY18 Community Development Block Grant request to support its LMA Water Main Improvements Program.

In 2018, this program proposes replacing the deteriorated Hathaway Road water main between Hathaway from Merl to Clifton. The project includes the new water main, street resurfacing, manhole sewer separations, sewer improvements, curb replacement, ADA-compliant curb ramps and other appurtenances. CDBG resources will fulfill Lakewood's matching funds requirement for a grant and zero percent interest loan the city received from the Ohio Public Works Commission.
