



## **Community Health Coordinator**

### **Introduction and Purpose**

The Community Health Coordinator will assist in implementation and evaluation phase of the initiative that builds off the 2018 Community Health Needs Assessment completed by OBCDC to ensure a healthy and equitable community for all in Old Brooklyn. The Community Health Coordinator reports to the Community Health Fellow.

### **Main Duties**

- Provide analysis and translation of data from 2018 CHNA
- Initiate research, design, and planning for CHNA drive, evidence-based community health interventions
- Implement, test, and report on CHNA community health interventions
- Assist in planning and execution of OBCDC community health programming, including but not limited to the 2018 Health In Action summit
- Assist in community health assessments of existing and future OBCDC programming
- Lead pre-K efforts around Step Up to Quality, partner with early childhood education providers, and local government agencies to increase the number of high quality seats in Old Brooklyn
- Actively participate in public health initiatives in Cleveland and Cuyahoga County
- Engage with residents and act as a liaison to Resident Advisory Council on community health
- Maintain relationships with partners of OBCDC's community health initiative
- Represent OBCDC and community meetings and in public forms

### **Preferred qualifications**

A candidate must have a background with community health research, planning, and intervention implementation and evaluation, a commitment to racial and equity inclusion, project management experience, and community organizing. She/he must possess strong communication skills, and have the ability to cultivate relationships with a diverse set of stakeholders.

Preferred experiences and skills: prior experience in community health working with minority populations, specifically seniors, Hispanic / Latino and African American, skills in group facilitation, training and resource deployment, community outreach, volunteer coordination, and quantitative analytical skills. Proficiency in MS Office is required.

Preferred academic qualifications: Masters in Public Health (or equivalent), Health Policy, Bioethics, Medical Anthropology, Sociology.
